GRADE 2

In literature this month we will be working on our second last strategy for written responses QPP (Question Per Page or Per Paragraph). We have now started doing a Daily Five on some mornings. Reading changes between reading and responding with a partner to individual reading every 5th or 6th day. In math, we will be starting a Unit on Measurement in April. In P.E. we are in the middle of games using basketballs. In science, we will be starting with Boats and Buoyancy. In this unit, students will explore what sinks what floats, and what makes an effective watercraft. Students will be learning about Prairie land: Saskatchewan. They will learn about the culture, language, geography heritage, economics and resources that shape Saskatoon.

GRADE 3

God's Sikh family is looking forward to the exciting learning adventures that the month of April will bring. In Mathematics: We will turn our focus on multiples of 3s, 4s, 10s, 10s and 100s. Talk with your child about the importance of learning his/her multiplication and division facts. Find opportunities to practise these facts with your child to build confidence and to establish a solid foundation. Here are some suggestions for activities you can do with your child. When walking down the street or driving in a car, have your child multiply the digits of 2digit house numbers. For example, for a house numbered 36, your child would multiply 3 x 6 to get 18. In L.A we started reading "Charlotte's Web". Through this literature, students will learn about friendship, love, compassion and empathy. In Social studies, we will continue to learn about India, Ukraine, Tunisia and Peru. When it comes to Science, we will move on to our building unit.

GRADE 4

For Language Arts, we will be focusing on our Novel Study, writing and understanding Poetry, our class will study about Tenses and writing sentences with Correct Subject-Verb Agreement. Grade 4's will conclude the sequencing unit and move to the "Making connections" reading comprehension strategy. In Mathematics, we will start Decimals followed by equations and shapes. For Science, we continue with our building unit. We will study about pulleys, gears and different forces to propel cars. For Social Studies, we continue to study about First Nations, colonization and how Alberta has changed over the years.

GRADE 5

Spring has finally come! We will start working on expository writing again, mainly newspaper writing for English Language Arts. As well, we will dive into sentence writing and acting again for April. We are excited to announce that we will be performing "The Sword in the Stone" for Division 1 classes. For science, we will continue with the Wetlands Ecosystem and as for math, we are going into our Measurement unit where we will learn about the metric system, area and perimeter, volume, and capacity. In social studies, we are excited to go on our field trip to the Military Museum on April 18th. It would be fantastic to have volunteers join us on our trip. As well, we will be continuing to learn about immigrants and Canada's changing identity in social studies.

This month at Gobind Sarvar School...

GRADE 6

In grade 6 students did a great job presenting their biography book talk project. Students will be preparing for the PAT's that are coming up shortly. We will be strengthening our understanding of how to write a narrative story using the 5 senses and the 5 w's. We will also be learning how to write a newspaper article in the coming month. In social studies, we continue to learn about democracy in ancient Athens. We will be starting our Iroquois unit soon after. This month in Math, students will continue with the unit of geometry where they will learn about constructing and comparing triangles also about the interior angles of triangles and quadrilateral. In Science we will start with our new unit Air and Aerodynamics. Students explore the characteristics of air and the interaction between moving air and solids. They learn that air is a compressible fluid, that it is composed of many gases, and that moving air can support solid materials in sustained flight.

GRADE 7

Students have been working on finishing their novel study *The Outsiders* and will now be working on how to write a 5-paragraph essay. Students continue to work on grammar skills as well as strategies to strengthen their reading skills. In social studies, students continue to do presentations to show their understanding of current events, and will be working on political, economic and military events that contributed to the foundations of Canada. In Math, students have started the month by learning to identify and plot points in the four quadrants of a Cartesian plane. They will also perform geometric constructions and learn to describe the characteristics of 3-D objects and 2-D shapes. In Science, students will start the new unit Heat and Temperature where the students investigate sources and uses of heat energy. Students explore different applications, investigate the scientific principles involved and consider questions about the nature of heat.
